Job Description

SEN Learning Support Assistant and Midday Supervisor

Reporting to	Senior Leadership Team
Salary/Grade	Grade 14 Point 4-6 £25,185 to £25,989
Hours	Full time. 30.43 hours per week Monday – Friday term time only plus 2 inset days

Purpose	• To provide 1: 1 support to a specific pupil with SEND under the instruction/ guidance of the SENDco and Class Teacher. • To undertake work/care/support programmes to enable access to learning for the pupils. • Work may be carried out in the classroom or outside the main teaching area • To safeguard the children of the school • To provide general lunchtime supervision to all students
Key Responsibilities	<u>Support for Pupils</u> • Supervise and provide support for the pupils ensuring their safety and access to appropriate learning activities. • Supervise and provide support for the pupils, ensuring their safety and access to playtimes. • Assist with the development and implementation of EHCP/Individual Learning Plans/Behaviour Management Plans or similar. • Establish a constructive relationship with pupils and interact with them according to their individual need. • Promote the inclusion and acceptance of all pupils. • Encourage the pupils to interact with others and engage in activities led by the teacher. • Follow expectations set in EHCP document that promote self-esteem and independence. Provide feedback to the pupils in relation to progress and achievement under guidance of the teacher, SENDCo and outside agencies. <u>Support for the Teacher</u> • Create and maintain a purposeful, orderly and supportive environment, in accordance with lesson plans.

Key Responsibilities

- Use strategies, in liaison with the teacher, to support the pupil to achieve learning goals.

Monitor pupil's responses to learning activities and accurately record achievement/progress as directed.

- Provide detailed and regular feedback to teachers on pupil's achievement, progress, problems etc. and record accurately
- Create positive and professional relationships with parents and sensitively but accurately relay the outcomes of the sessions attended.
- Promote good pupil behaviour, dealing promptly with conflict and incidents in line with established policy and encourage pupils to take responsibility for their own behaviour.

Support for the Curriculum

- Undertake structured and agreed learning activities/teaching programmes and interventions adjusting activities according to pupil responses.
- Support the use of ICT in learning activities and with specific programmes to support learning eg Unlocking Letters and Sounds.
- Prepare, maintain and use equipment/resources required to meet the lesson plans/relevant learning activity and assist pupils in their use.

External visits

- Extend support to curriculum enrichment activities within and outside of school. Ensure the children's safety and enjoyment of these activities, with due regard to the lead teachers plans and assist in any preparation required.

Support for the School

- Be aware of and comply with policies and procedures relating to child protection, health, safety and security, confidentiality and data protection, reporting all concerns to an appropriate person.
- Be aware of and support difference and ensure all pupils have equal access to opportunities to learn and develop.
- Contribute to the overall ethos/work/aims of the school.
- Appreciate and support the role of other professionals.
- Attend and participate in relevant meetings as required.
- Participate in training and other learning activities and performance development as required.
- Assist with the supervision of pupils out of lesson times, including before and after school and at lunchtime.
- Accompany teaching staff and pupils on visits, trips and out of school activities as required and take responsibility for this pupil under the supervision of the teacher, and alongside the parent if deemed appropriate.

Lunchtime duties

- Supervise children during lunch breaks, ensuring their safety and wellbeing at all times.
- Encourage positive behaviour and promote a respectful, inclusive playground environment.

	• Assist children during mealtimes, providing support where needed and encouraging good table manners. • Monitor playground activities and intervene promptly to resolve minor disputes and prevent accidents. • Administer basic first aid and report any incidents or concerns in line with school procedures. • Support pupils with additional needs to ensure they can participate safely and confidently. • Maintain effective communication with teaching staff regarding pupil behaviour, welfare, and incidents. • Ensured school safeguarding, health and safety, and behaviour policies are consistently followed. • Help set up and clear dining areas, maintaining a clean and hygienic environment. Build positive relationships with pupils, encouraging cooperation, confidence, and social development. <u>Safeguarding</u> The Wessex Learning Trust is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people. All staff working within the Trust are expected to share a commitment to doing this. You will be expected to follow and promote the procedures in the child protection and safeguarding policy and report any concerns in accordance with agreed procedures.
